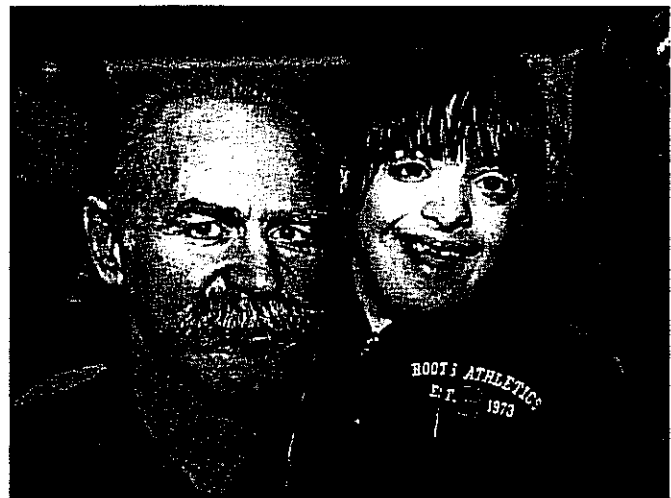


While we are still tabulating results and our preliminary reports indicate that we are on track to achieve our fundraising goal of more than \$60,000.
